OPENNESS – the driving force behind the library publishing programme at USUST

- Our report on the publishing activities of the USUST Scientific Library is a story of how a few staff members (since 2009), enthusiastic about the possibilities and prospects of Open Access, decided to introduce a library publishing programme to meet the needs of scholars and succeeded in doing so.
- Today, we are the only university library in Ukraine represented in the Library Publishing Directory and the Global Library Publishing Map.
- The uncertainty of crisis times (Covid 19 pandemic, war), the transition to distance learning and online education gave impetus to a new round of openness working with Open Textbooks




When the unreal became real...

- Using every opportunity (cessation of the air raid alarm, restoration of power supply, good communication, etc.), we worked both remotely and physically in the library.
- We worked in basements and subways, in cafes and cars, in "invincibility points" or corridors between two walls to avoid possible injuries from windows during bombing
- They withstood working in cold rooms in offices or library halls at a constant temperature of only 6-9 degrees Celsius, as Russian missiles systematically destroyed critical infrastructure throughout Ukraine.
- The Library's servers and website, the websites of scientific journals and the repository, social media, and all communication channels became like living beings with whom the librarians talked and negotiated: "Don't let us down, because we still have so much to do!"


On promoting the overcoming of the Ukrainian linguocide in educational resources : Open textbooks

The USUST Library decided to add a new area of activity and focus its efforts on Open Educational Resources, including Open Textbooks, as one of the methods of overcoming the Ukrainian linguocide in educational resources.

All 8 textbooks and 4 posters are integrated into OERSI (Open Educational Resources Search Index)




Librarians of USUST: Became the heroes of the Godcast "Voices of Global Open Education"

Digital library publishing services USUST + Textual Open Educational Resources

- The Library Publishing business model relies on subsidies from the library budget rather than working to recover costs or generate profit from its activities
- Open textbooks: a working group of 5 librarians with experience in openness has been created, but working in different departments and in different areas (open access journals, repository, information literacy training).
- Publishing products are maximally visible on the Internet with the help of metadata and search engine optimisation and are integrated into various global databases of scientific and educational information
